PADI Open Water SCUBA Diving Course for Elearners

Course prerequisites:

Students must be at least 12 years of age.

Students must be enrolled with Padi elearning online (\$120 charge payable to PADI) and linked to Kohala Divers.

Students under the age of 18 must have the signature of a parent or guardian. If there are any questions to which you've answered "yes" on the medical form, you must present a Padi medical release signed by your doctor before starting the class.

Our program provides students with a review of elearning information, confined water lessons, and two days of open-ocean diving (a total of four boat dives).

COST: \$520.00

Includes PADI elearning Crew Pak (Padi logbook, recreational dive planner or Erdp), boat dives and use of all equipment except for timing device.

TIME REQUIRED: Approximately four 6 hour days.

STUDENTS TO PROVIDE:

- Completed and signed forms (medical statement*, waivers, student record file – all included with PADI Crew Pak)
- Timing device
- Towel and sunscreen

please note: If there are any questions that have been answered YES on your Medical form, you need to get a medical release from us for your doctor to sign before starting class.

DISCOUNTS: 10% off boat dives after class.

COURSE ITINERARY

Day 1 PM

Meet with instructor for Elearning review, signing of releases and confined water sessions 1-3.

Day 2 AM

7:30AM 5-6 hours. Check in at the dive center for open water dives 1 and 2. *Bring your Padi RDP, log book, timing device and a towel.* Dive 1 is pure fun, no skills; dive 2 you will perform skills covered in the first pool sessions. Between dives, test your open-ocean endurance: swim 200 yards and tread water for 10 minutes. Return to dock and fill in log books.

Day 3 PM

1:30 PM second pool session 1-2 hours. Finish confined water session 4-5 if needed.

Day 4 AM

7:30AM Check in at the dive center for open water dives 3 and 4. *Remember your RDP, logbook, timing device and towel!* The skill portion of each dive takes only 15 – 20 minutes; the remaining time is a fun tour of the reef.

1:00PM Back at the dive center: complete logbook entries, diver registration, and pose for certification photo! You will be issued a temporary Open Water Diver card; your permanent card should arrive in the mail within 6 weeks.

Please note that this is only an outline of the Padi Open Water Diver Course. You do not need to complete everything in four days! This is the minimum time required to become a certified Open Water Diver. Time permitting, students may prefer to extend the course over more days, take a break between pool lessons and boat dives. Diving is a fun activity, so we want you to set your own pace, a schedule that works best for you. Our classes are always small, no more than six students, so everyone gets lots of attention - in and out of the water!
